FAMILY SERVICES


Mattie Rhodes Center utilizes a **family-focused**, **strength based model** of therapeutic and social services in providing support, guidance, and tools to address personal needs and difficult circumstances.

Nuevo Dia and **Otro Camino** programs offer a range of services such as counseling, service coordination, legal support, and child-focused therapy for survivors of intimate partner violence and their children.

The **Nuevo Amanecer** program provides individual and group treatment for persons struggling with substance abuse challenges and their families to increase the level of overall functioning and well being of participants.

CULTURAL ARTS

We believe that the arts are a basic and integral part of every person's education and growth. The agency strives to educate the community about Latino culture and traditions through the visual arts.



YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

The **EXPLORE** youth development program provides innovative and educational out-of-school programming for youth located in the Historic Northeast, Westside and Wyandotte area. Our programs focus on cultural tolerance, dealing with negative peer pressure, conflict resolution and more. Additionally, we provide crisis intervention, service coordination and therapy to youth at multiple schools to prevent bullying, violent behavior, and substance abuse.

The **Visionaries Program** connects young adults with developmental disabilities with peers, social activities, classes, and field trips to focus on individual strengths and build self-esteem.

Soccer for Success is a free after school program that uses soccer as a tool to address children's health issues and juvenile delinquency.

COMMUNITY SUPPORT

We provide **health and wellness programs** to encourage healthy, active living including a community garden, and opportunities to engage in physical exercise through workshops & classes.

Our team seeks to empower communities by encouraging, involving and enabling residents, city officials and business owners to work together to create positive impact and improve the livability of our communities.

Northeast Alliance Together (NEAT) spearheads community outreach by focusing on commercial and residential development, housing, transportation and public safety.




